

## NOTICE TO COMMUNITY RESIDENTS REGARDING HURRICANE WARNING

**The National Weather Service is predicting that a hurricane may affect our community very soon. We suggest that you take steps to protect yourself in the event that severe weather occurs.**

A few tips include:

- If you have not already done so, you should consider creating a family disaster plan.
- Consider what personal belongings—such as prescriptions, personal documents and photographs—you may want to take with you in the event of an evacuation.
- Pay close attention to local media, such as television and radio. Follow any instructions given by government authorities, including the mayor, county officials or the police or sheriff's department, to evacuate the area. **Please comply with any evacuation instructions.**
- **At this time, local authorities have:**
  - Called for a voluntary evacuation**
  - Called for a mandatory evacuation**
  - Not issued evacuation instructions.**
- Please let local authorities, such as the police department or sheriff's department, know immediately if you have a disability that may prevent you from evacuating. Please also let local authorities know if you are aware of any of your neighbors who may also need assistance.
- If you have to evacuate, remove things from your refrigerator that would spoil and cause odor or health problems and consider putting other valuables on top of kitchen/bathroom counters, tables, or beds to minimize possible damage from rising water.
- If no evacuation is suggested or required, we suggest that you take steps to ensure you have adequate food, water and other emergency supplies. We suggest that you:
  - Fill your bathtub with water
  - Fill with clean water any containers suitable for drinking water
  - Stock up on canned or other non-perishable food
  - Have several flashlights and spare batteries
- Remember that due to fire hazards, do not use candles, kerosene lamps or flammable materials inside your apartment.

We do not represent that these are all the preparations you should undertake. In an emergency, call 911.
