# **Volunteer Group Descriptions**

- (1) Scope of Work
  - (a) Meetings TAA Winter, Summer and Fall Board of Directors meetings, unless otherwise noted
  - (b) Reports On a to-be-determined schedule, report on committee work to the Board of Directors
  - (c) Anticipated time commitment Three one-hour, in-person meetings plus other virtual meetings (as needed)
- (2) Term Length One year unless otherwise noted
- (3) Eligibility Current member of TAA Board of Directors unless otherwise noted
- (4) Selection/Appointment Process
  - (a) Members of the Board of Directors may join committees at the TAA Winter Board of Directors meeting
  - (b) TAA members not serving on the Board of Directors may submit requests to be appointed to the TAA President
  - (c) The TAA President may make additional appointments as outlined in TAA's Bylaws and Standing Rules

- **Volunteer Roles** Board of Directors delegate, Work Group Chair, Committee Chair, Committee Vice Chair, Volunteer Spokesperson, Lyceum Graduate
- Experience Level 3-5 years at the state level

# **Level 3 – Strategic Volunteer Leader**

- TAA Knowledge Completed TAA 301 Webinar
- **Volunteer Roles** Board of Directors delegate, Committee Chair, Executive Committee member, Officer; Lyceum Graduate
- Experience Level Proven record of effectively serving in a leadership position of a TAA volunteer group; average leadership experience of 5 years or more at the state level

# **Board of Director Delegate**

# I. Minimum Qualifications

TAA Level 1 Volunteer

# II. Key Job Responsibilities

- A. Attend quarterly meetings of TAA Board of Directors (Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall)
- B. Serve on a TAA Committee
- C. At the request of the TAA President, serve on a TAA Workgroup or Appointed Committee (Legislative, Product/Service Council, ONE Conference, Leadership, Budget & Finance)
- D. Self-select other TAA committees to join during Winter Board meeting
- E. Prepare for and participate in committee meetings, workgroup meetings and meetings of the TAA Board of Directors
- F. Serve as an information conduit between TAA and your local association

#### III. Selection

A. Local Associations submit Board of Director delegates to TAA

# **Committee Chair**

### I. Minimum Qualifications

TAA Level 3 Volunteer

### II. Key Job Responsibilities

- A. Chair committee meetings
- B. Create a welcoming environment for all committee members
- C. Work with TAA staff liaison as appropriate to develop agendas, prepare background materials for committee meetings, schedule committee meetings, prepare minutes and reports, and otherwise keep the committee functioning
- D. Lead members in the work of the committee as defined by the Committee Description
- E. Work with the committee to develop an annual plan of work with clearly stated objectives, timeline and resources
- F. Report to TAA Board of Directors and Executive Committee as appropriate (at least annually)
- G. Conduct assessment of the group and committee members

### **Executive Committee Member**

# I. Minimum Qualifications

TAA Level 3 Volunteer

# II. Key Job Responsibilities

- A. Attend four quarterly meetings of TAA Board of Directors and Executive Committee (Winter, Spring, Summer and Fall)
- B. Vice Presidents at Large serve as a liaison for assigned local associations and as a liaison for assigned committees or workgroups
- C. Serve as an Executive Committee liaison for other TAA committees
- D. At the request of a TAA President, serve on a TAA Workgroup or Appointed Committee (Legislative, Product/Service Council, ONE Conference, Leadership, Budget & Finance)

#### III. Selection

- A. Leadership Committee develops the slate of Officers and Vice Presidents at Large
- B. TAA Board of Directors considers the slate presented by the Leadership Committee at the Fall meeting

# I. Minimum Qualifications

# II. Key Job Responsibilities

Provide guidance, advice, feedback and support to mentees/volunteers

### III. Selection

A. Nominations accepted; evaluated by Leadership Committee or other advisory group

### Officer

### I. Minimum Qualifications

TAA Level 3 Volunteer

### II. Key Job Responsibilities

- A. Lead TAA's volunteers, members and local associations
- B. Chair meetings of the TAA Executive Committee, TAA Board of Directors and/or committees or workgroups
- C. Attend local association installations or other events
- D. Serve as a spokesperson for TAA
- E. **President** Appoint committee chairs and members as outlined in TAA Bylaws & Standing Rules
- F. **Treasurer** Chair TAA Budget & Finance Committee, which approves TAA's annual budget, audit and tax returns

#### III. Selection

- A. Members of the Board of Directors submit written nominations to the Leadership Committee
- B. Leadership Committee prepares slate of Officers for Board consideration
- C. TAA Board of Directors approves considers nomination slate at Fall Board of Directors Meeting
- D. President-Elect automatic succession to President

# **Volunteer Spokesperson**

### I. Minimum Qualifications

# II. Key Job Responsibilities

- A. Participate in TAA media training
- B. Respond on TAA's behalf to media interview requests (often on short notice)
- C. Review and familiarize yourself with TAA-provided interview prep materials
- D. Provide context for how your rental property is impacted by the interviewer's subject matter

# Workgroup Chair

# I. Minimum Qualifications

TAA Level 2 Volunteer

### II. Key Job Responsibilities

- A. Chair workgroup meetings
- B. Work with TAA staff liaison to prepare agendas and materials aligned with workgroup purpose and objectives as identified by TAA President
- C. Report to TAA Board of Directors and Executive Committee as appropriate
- D. Conduct all meetings and work in a manner consistent with TAA's commitment to a diverse, inclusive and equitable culture

### **III.** Meeting Requirements

Workgroups meet primarily virtually. In-person meetings may be requested by the chair when needed to accomplish workgroup objective.

# **Budget & Finance Committee**

# I. Committee Purpose

- A. Recommend financial policies that support TAA's assets, vision, mission and strategy
- B. Review annual TAA budget and forward to Executive Committee for consideration
- C. Review annual financial statements for fairness and accuracy
- D. Monitor investment reports
- E. Review communications from external auditors and work with staff to implement recommendations
- F. Recommend an external auditor to the Executive Committee
- G. Review annual Form 990 prior to submission to IRS

### II. Composition

- A. TAA Treasurer
- B. TAA Secretary
- C. Up to four TAA members appointed by the TAA President
- D. Immediate Past President and Executive Vice President serve as ex officio members

### **Education Committee**

# **Committee Purpose**

- A. Establish criteria and selection process for TAA's professional awards
- B. Discuss industry education needs and recommend topics for TAA educational programs
- D. Evaluate proposals for TAA ONE Conference & Expo education sessions

### **Ethics Committee**

## I. Committee Purpose

- A. Promote and sustain a culture of ethical conduct throughout TAA
- B. Oversee implementation of TAA Ethics and Whistleblower Policies
- C. Review any questions pertaining to TAA Conflicts of Interest Policy
- D. Evaluate and make recommendation to the Executive Committee whether "cause," as that term is defined in Standing Rule 4, exists for the removal of a member of TAA's Board of Directors or Executive Committee

# **Leadership Committee**

# I. Committee Purpose

- A. To assist the Board of Directors in fulfilling its responsibilities for the nomination and election of Officers and Vice Presidents at Large
- B. To foster volunteer leadership opportunities at TAA through the establishment of a Volunteer Management Strategy
- C. To create a transparent leadership pathway for volunteers
- D. To foster a "hospitality culture" for TAA's activities

# II. Composition

- A. Three most immediate Past Presidents of TAA
- B. TAA President
- C. TAA President-Elect
- D. Two TAA members (must be rental housing owner representatives

### III. Eligibility

- A. Current Past President, President or President-Elect of TAA
- B. Member of TAA

### IV. Selection

- A. TAA President appoints two TAA members
- B. Three Most Immediate Past Presidents
- C. Current TAA President

# **Leadership Lyceum Committee**

# I. Committee Purpose

- A. Cultivate future leaders of TAA
- B. Help guide TAA's Leadership Lyceum program to ensure its continued relevance and value to participants
- C. Provide a networking opportunity for Leadership Lyceum class members and graduates

# **Legislative Committee**

### I. Committee Purpose

- A. Discuss and evaluate public policy issues impacting rental housing industry
- B. Adopt formal public policy positions for TAA
- C. Select office holders and candidates for state elective offices to receive TAA PAC contributions and endorsements
- D. Establish TAA's affirmative legislation for each Texas Legislative session
- E. Evaluate proposed legislation TAA will support or oppose during the Texas Legislative session

### II. Size & Term

- A. 15 + Committee Vice Chair (appointed by TAA Treasurer during second year of two-year committee term)
- B. Two-year term

# III. Eligibility

- A. Current member of the TAA Board of Directors (voting or alternate). Must be rental housing owner or management company representatives
- B. Level 2 or 3 volunteers
- C. TAA member appointed by TAA President

### IV. Selection

- A. TAA President appoints one committee member from each of TAA's five largest local associations. Local associations submit nominees to President.
- B. TAA President appoints one committee member from each of the following five regions of the state Panhandle Region, West Texas Region, Central Texas Region, East Texas Region and Coastal Region. Each local association in each region shall submit a list of nominees for the President to select from
- C. TAA Executive Committee member selected and appointed by TAA President
- D. Two At Large members selected and appointed by TAA President
- E. Most recent Past Chairman of Legislative Committee willing to serve
- F. TAA President selects and appoints Committee Chair
- G. Alternate Committee Members TAA President shall appoint one alternate committee member per each of the five largest local associations and five regions. Local associations shall submit a list of nominees for consideration as alternatives.

#### II. Term

One-year term beginning June 1 and ending May 31 of following year

### III. Selection

Appointed by TAA President-Elect

## **Product/Service Council**

### I. Committee Purpose

- A. Enhance the profile of TAA's supplier partner members by engaging in volunteer activities and other initiatives designed to benefit TAA.
- B. Increase awareness of the benefits associated with Product/Service membership
- C. Raise TAA owner/operator/manager members' awareness of the professionalism and benefits of engaging TAA supplier partner members.
- D. Provide a forum for TAA's supplier partner members to learn more about how they can play a role at TAA

#### II. Size

Up to 55 members

### III. Eligibility

- A. Supplier partner members who serve as (a) a voting or alternate delegate on the TAA Board of Directors, (b) a president of a local association, (c) a president of a local association's Product/Service Council or (d) Past Chair of the TAA PSC may apply to the TAA President to serve on the TAA Product/Service Council
- B. Tier 1-3 sponsors of TAA (Tier 1 up to 3 representatives per company, Tier 2 up to 2 representatives per company, Tier 1 1 representative per company)
- C. TAA supplier partner members appointed by TAA President

### IV. Selection

- A. TAA 1 -3 sponsors designate representatives to serve on Product/Service Council
- B. All others are appointed by the TAA President
